

You can earn a tuition-free college degree while in high school

early college at Montcalm Community College allows high school students to earn up to two years of college credit, or an associate degree or occupational training certificate, while completing their high school education. The three-year program encompasses grades 11 through 13.

Students benefit from a personalized learning environment that fosters the development of critical thinking skills within an innovative curriculum that promotes excellence in the fields of math, English, social studies and science.



benefits

- Earn a high school diploma and up to 60 college credits, tuition free.
- Reduce time in college by one year if an associate degree is earned.
- Successfully transition to a college environment.
- No tuition or fees paid by the students or their families.
- Potential savings of \$25,000 to \$50,000 (if a student planned to attend a university and live on campus).
- Students may still participate in activities at their home school such as athletics, performing arts and clubs.

eligibility

Students attending a participating district may apply in their sophomore year. Home and private school students must enroll in a public school to apply.

location

Students will spend their entire school day on an MCC campus for grades 11 through 13.

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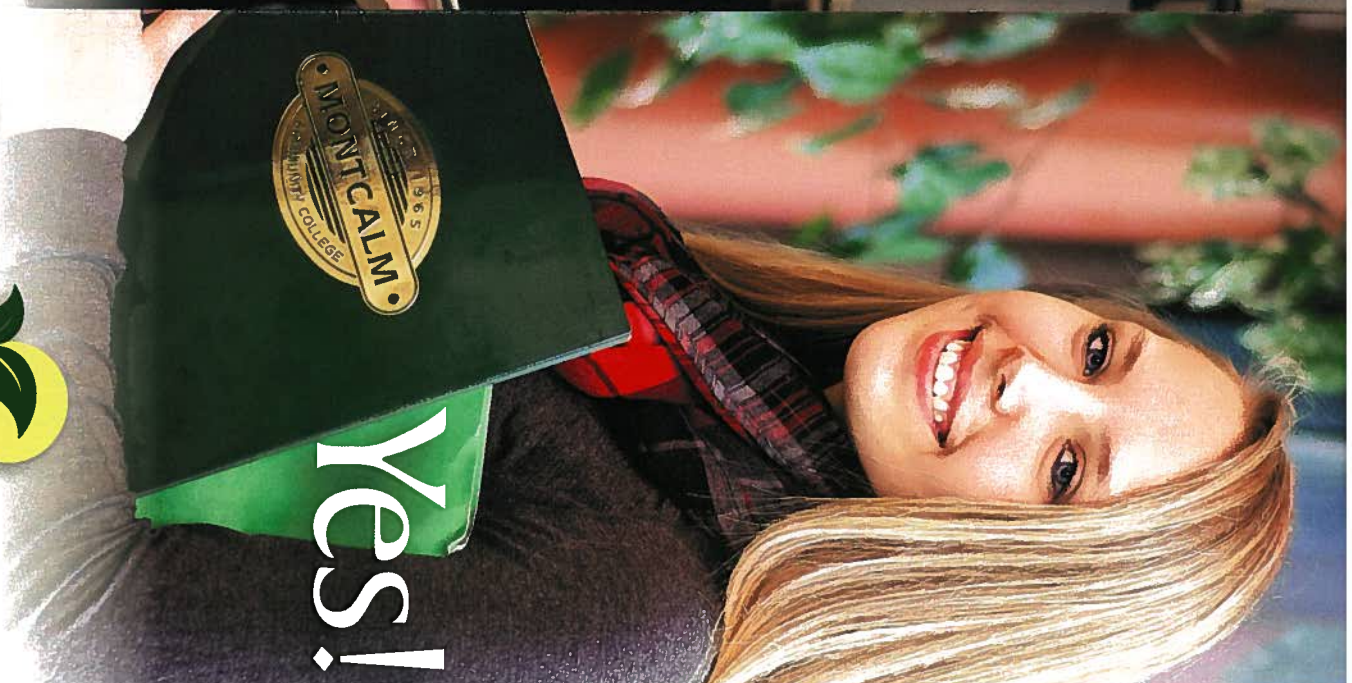


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
