At this point in the agenda I'd like to take some time to talk about the theme and give you some background on our guest speakers.

When our opening day planning committee was debating potential themes for this year we discussed many possibilities. In then end we settled on "MAISD- we are everywhere". We decided on that theme because we felt it was important to focus on the fact that the work that you do on a daily basis goes far beyond your classroom, your school bus, or your school building. It goes far beyond the city or town you work in or travel through, it goes beyond our county borders and our state borders and in some instances the work you do is felt on a global level. During our discussion we all agreed MAISD is truly everywhere. The children that you teach or transport and the families that we serve are all affected much more deeply than what you will ever know. The child you help has a family that is sometimes located nearby, sometimes not. Think about those that we serve as each having a web that connects them to others that are part of their lives. It's easy to fall into the trap of believing we are servicing a small group of children and families when in reality your work with them affects their aunts, uncles, grandparents, nieces, nephews all over the our state, our nation and most likely in some cases all over the world.

I was recently visited by a middle aged woman whose mother is currently receiving hospice services. Through this process they are identifying organizations for people to donate to at the time of her mother's passing. I was humbled to hear that her mother chose the Montcalm Area Intermediate School District as one of the beneficiaries. The daughter went on to tell that she was one of six children, three of which received services from our organization between 30 to forty years ago. She talked about the reverence, respect, and admiration that her mother still has for our staff and for our organization because of the outstanding service and treatment that her children received. She spoke of how her mother was a single mom who raised six children, three of which had disabilities and without our organization all of her children- those with disabilities in those without- would not have done as well in life as they were

able to. This is a testament to the statement that the Montcalm Area Intermediate School District is
indeed everywhere. It is just one example of our staff having a positive effect on a family that- number
one, spread far beyond the classroom and number two, has been felt for a long period of time. I
guarantee that those teachers, bus drivers, paraprofessionals, secretaries, food service workers,
custodians, and administrators who were working with this family at that time had no idea how far of a
reach both in space and time that their efforts would have on this particular family. Be assured that the
work you are doing now is felt not only by the child in your room or on your bus, it is felt by their
family and their friends and everyone else they are connected to both here in Montcalm County, across
the state, and across the nation. And know that it will be felt for years and years and in fact it will be felt
