WHAT THE DATA SHOWS US:

- 26.5% of children ages birth to seventeen live in poverty. This is a 3% decrease from 2010.
- 56.3% of our students receive free or reduced school lunch assistance.
- 32% of Montcalm County mothers who gave birth did not receive appropriate health care. This is average has improved by 4% from last year.
- 55.4% of Montcalm County births are paid for by Medicaid. State average: 44.8%.
- 81% of Montcalm County's 19-35 month immunization rates. State average:74%.
- 68.8% of children ages 1-4 are participating in Women, Infant, & Children (WIC).
- Montcalm County has seen an increase in the number of children birth to five that were substantiated for child abuse and neglect. From 10.4% in 2009 to 25.7% in 2012. The state average is 14.6%.
 - 265 birth to five children were served through Early ON & Special Education services in 2011.

We want to take this opportunity to remind you that the first five years of a child's life are a time of great opportunity. By age six, ninety percent of a child's brain development will have been established. We are working hard to promote that Parents are their child's first and best teacher, therefore supporting parents is critical in Montcalm County. In Montcalm County during 2011 there were 739 births and a total of 3,602 birth to five children living in Montcalm County. These numbers are at an all-time low.
