X. MAISD BOND PROPOSAL PRESENTATION

Superintendent Kyle Hamlin led the board through a review of the bond proposal and the expenses that would be covered by the funds authorized by this bond if it were to be approved by the voters. The bond request is in the amount of \$36.8 million and will equal .065 mills. The bond request will be placed on the ballot for the Presidential Primary election which is scheduled for February 27, 2024.

X – 2. PRESENTATON FROM MAISD EARLY CHILDHOOD LITRACY COACH

Heather Phillips presented information about the Literacy Coaches Network supporting local districts in Montcalm County with focus on continuous improvement initiatives to increase academic achievement in literacy and math instruction. This initiative is partially supported by the Educator on Loan program.

XI. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS/COMMENTS/INFORMATION ITEMS

Tricia Root, Associate Superintendent of Finance

• Contract negotiations will begin soon in several districts. Tricia will be involved in both Lakeview and Montcalm Area ISD. It will be a new process now given the legislative changes in the public employee collective bargaining legislation.

Daniel Brant, Associate Superintendent of Special Education

- The Santa Shop will be held at the Seiter Center on December 6 as organized by Greenville Middle School students and Greenville Rotary Club.
- There are 23 vacant positions in the special education department.
- There is a state-wide 1% cap for the number of students who should take an alternative state assessment. The state has exceeded this cap for many years and continues to work toward the 1% goal. Currently, Montcalm Area ISD is at 1.8% of students taking an alternative assessment.
- Montcalm Area ISD has updated their Special Education Plan.
- The State has revised the process and procedure model for LRE. Montcalm Area ISD has been working with local districts to assure our model is in alignment as well.

Adel DiOrio, Associate Superintendent of Instruction

- Angie Adams presented at the Continuous Improvement Network state level conference.
- Mirand Holmberg supported six local districts in achieving their Multi-Tiered Systems of Support awards for data integration and/or behavior improvement.
- Kris Lindsey was a presenter at the Special Populations Conference in Lansing regarding Meeting the Needs of the Whole Child.
- Adel presented at the Continuous Improvement Conference.
- Montcalm County educators are participating in a four part series facilitated by a national trainer from Solution Tree about implementing the practice of Professional Learning Communities.

Shannon Tripp, Associate Superintendent of CTE/Early College

- The house built by the Constructions Trades program has been sold for \$55,000 and will be relocated by the buyer in the coming days.
- Montcalm Community College will be assisting with promotion of the Early College program.
- November 21 Sophomore Visitation at the Montcalm Area Career Center.
- December 5 Birdhouse build hosted at Montcalm Area Career Center for 2nd graders.
- December 15 Pancake breakfast for students at Montcalm Area Career Center.
