CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

Entering the classroom

Students should place their backpacks in the space designated, turn off their phones, place them in their assigned pocket at the front of the room and take their seats.

Tardy to class

Those who are not in their seats when the bell rings will be considered tardy. It is an expectation of this class that students will be prepared and ready to begin when the bell rings. If your bus arrives late, please come directly to class. If you drive and are late you will lose 5 professionalism points. The doors will be locked and you will need to check in at the office.

Pen or Pencil

The chief focus of the Health Science class is to prepare students for clinical job shadowing. As a result, it is mandatory that students write in black or blue ink only for all documentation assignments, as this is required by clinical sites. All other assignments you may use pencil.

Classroom/Lab Materials Needed

All lab supplies will be provided in the classroom. You will be provided one notebook and one three ring binder. Please bring or wear closed toed shoes while in the lab area and have hair pulled up when practicing skills or completing check offs.

Leaving during class

If you need to use the restroom you may do so without asking, however we ask that you sign out at the door using your name and military time. No more than two students may be signed out at a time so please respect each other's time and be quick. If you must leave for an appointment you will need to sign out at the office as well.

Tracking daily assignments

Students will receive assignments on a daily basis in the Health Class. These are to be completed as assigned. When finished with an assignment, students are to place their work in the correct AM or PM bin on the front desk. You will have time to work on homework or assignments in class, please use your time wisely or you will lose this time.

Returning assignments to students

Assignments will be returned to the student's mailbox after the grade is placed in PowerSchool.

Finding out grade status

We are always available to discuss classroom assignments as well as any grading concerns the student may have. Grades will be placed in the MACC PowerSchool on a weekly basis. Students and parents may access grades from the MACC PowerSchool at any time by logging in. Please remember, you must log in to the MACC PowerSchool, not your home school's portal.

Student responsibilities after an absence are:

- Speak with classroom student administration or Instructor to find out what assignments have been missed.
- You are allowed 1 day to complete missing work. For example, if the student is absent on a Tuesday it is expected that the missing work will be due on Thursday.
- If the student is absent on the day of a test, it is expected that the student will take the test on the first day back to class.
- You are responsible for checking Google classroom. We will not come looking for you for missed assignments.
- You or a parent must call or text if you are going to be absent from class. Please
 understand that excessive absences may prevent you from participation in the certified
 nurse aide program.

Late, missing, or incomplete assignments

If you miss a day you may turn in your work the next day in class. It is the discretion of the instructor to accept late work and the points earned will decrease each day it is late. Health Science is for those students considering a career in the healthcare field. These careers require that you complete work in a timely fashion. This policy is non-negotiable. Remember we do take incomplete assignments as some points are better than no points.

Communication procedures with parents and families

Parents will receive communication from the Instructors on an as needed basis. We have an open door policy and are always happy to discuss any concerns students,or parents may have. If you need to discuss your student with us, please call 616-225-5730 and we will gladly make an appointment with you.

Ending class

The Health Science class is a TEAM environment. As a result, it is the expectation of the Instructors that the students will assist in room tasks, such as laundry, bed making, and trash removal as assigned. This is done on a daily basis during the last 10 minutes of class time.

Communication procedures with parents and families

Identify whether you will initiate any regular communication with families. Provide information on when, where, and how family members can get in touch with you. Also provide information about when you will be posting grades in PowerSchool and when families can expect updates.

Other

- Please bring or wear closed toed shoes while in the lab area and have hair pulled up when practicing skills or completing check offs.
- No horseplay in the lab or with the equipment as it is expensive to replace.
- Classroom rules and norms: BULLYING OF ANY KIND WILL NOT BE TOLERATED! If You are being bullied, report it immediately! Swift action will be taken. Bullying may result in expulsion from the Health Science Class.
- Students are expected to participate in all clinical skills learning, practicing, and testing. Lab participation IS NOT OPTIONAL.

CONSEQUENCES FOR CLASSROOM RULE VIOLATIONS

These will vary according to the seriousness of the rule violation and will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

CONSEQUENCES FOR CODE-OF-CONDUCT VIOLATIONS
