CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

Entering the classroom

Get any necessary materials, books, computer, and find your seat.

Tardy to class

Class starts when the bell rings or when your bus arrives. If you are a driver, you are expected to be in class when the bell rings, not when your school's bus arrives. If your bus arrives after the bell rings, you are expected to come directly to class. Arrivals after start times will result in the student being marked tardy and the loss of 5 participation/professionalism points.

Classroom/Lab Materials Needed

Take-home books should always be brought to class, as should something to write with. Appropriate clothing on PT days is expected. Failure to bring appropriate materials will result in the loss of participation/professionalism points.

Leaving during class

Students may use the restroom as needed during class, without asking. Only ONE student may be out of the room at a time, and you must use the bathroom closest to the classroom. Students must sign out and take the hall pass. If you're leaving school, you must sign out in the office.

Tracking daily assignments

Most assignments will be turned in on Google Classroom. Some may be done and turned in on paper. When turning in an assignment, click "turn in" or "submit," NOT "share."

Returning assignments to students

Students may keep printed assignments for review/study after grades are recorded.

Finding out grade status

Grades are posted in Powerschool as they're recorded. They are immediately updated at that time. Students can inquire about their grade during down time, work time, or before/after class.

Student responsibilities after an absence

If students are going to be absent, they must either call or send an email or Remind message BEFORE the start of class. This must be done by the student or parent, NOT by having your friend in class tell the instructor you're not coming. Failure to do this will result in the loss of 5 participation/professionalism points.

Check Google Classroom for assignments or talk to the instructor. Students will not get extra time for assignments unless they're sick for extended periods. Assignments are due when

they're due! It is your responsibility to check assignments when not in class. Missed tests will be made up in class without penalty.

Late, missing, or incomplete assignments

Assignments can be turned in a maximum of one day late. Late assignments will result in the loss of 20% of total assignment points. No credit will be given for assignments turned in more than one day late.

Communication procedures with parents and families

I am available through Remind at any time, and will make announcements to students through it. Parents can login to Remind and get these messages if desired. I will also be in contact with parents through email and posts to the class Facebook page.

Ending class

The room must be cleaned at the end of class. Chairs must be pushed in, trash cleaned up, tables cleaned, floor cleaned, and equipment put in its proper place. Class ends when the announcement dismisses your school. Students may not leave early.

Other

- Food and drinks are allowed, but will go away if they become a problem. In exchange, students will clean tables daily and will vacuum floors as needed. If I can't find volunteers to do this, food and drinks will go away. I have food and drinks available for sale in class. Everything is \$1. This money will go to class for equipment, supplies, field trips, and fun things like parties.
- Phones... leave them put away. I don't want to see them during lectures, movies, projects, or when anything else is going on. If you are done with everything, and nothing is going on, like at the end of class, you may check your phone. Same goes for playing on computers.
- Participation points. Everyone will start out with 100 points for professionalism and participation. Rule violations will result in a reduction of your total grade by 5 points per violation. No show absences, playing on your phone, profanity, and minor behavior issues are examples of things that may cost you 5 points.
- Don't get into the class supplies or personal possessions of anyone without permission.
- Book/Notes. You may use one page of handwritten notes on quizzes first semester. All quizzes and tests second semester are open book.

CONSEQUENCES FOR CLASSROOM RULE/ CODE-OF-CONDUCT VIOLATIONS

Consequences for rule violations range from a warning, loss of privileges, loss of professionalism/participation points, zeros on assignments, calls/emails home, up to referral to home schools for suspension, and removal from the MACC. Consequences for violations of the student code of conduct or other rules will be handled according to the student handbook (see Behavior Expectations and Continuum of Response charts).
