CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

Entering the classroom

- -Sit Quietly
- -Begin bell work at your home schools starting time or before
- -The teacher will provide instruction for the day when the last bus arrives

Tardy to class

If you arrive past the time your schools bus arrives you'll need a tardy pass. Three tardies in the same month will result in a write up.

Classroom/Lab Materials Needed

Classroom

- -Write in pencil only
- -Masks

Welding Lab

- -Steel toe work boots
- -Blue jeans without holes
- -Cotton t-shirt or sweatshirt
- -Safety glasses (regular glasses must also be cover by safety glasses)
- -Masks

Leaving during class

Students who wish to leave during classroom and lab hours must ask the teacher or parapro, then sign out and take the bathroom/hall pass. Those who fail to sign out or ask permission first may fall victim to at-random attendance checks. Once a day there will be a silent random attendance check; if a student is a not in the room and has not asked to leave that student shall be given an automatic write-up. If you wish to leave the Career Center early, you must sign out in the office; also refer the student handbook policy.

Tracking daily assignments

A schedule for both 1st and 2nd year students will be posted in the classroom on the 4X6 white boards. Also, Powerschool will show current and up to date assignment list.

Returning assignments to students

Bell ringers are used as an entry ticket to the welding lab for the day, therefore they must be completed and checked by the teacher or parapro before leaving the classroom.

Welding labs are graded at the end of each day and are given back to the student immediately. **Test** are automatically graded by AWS and students will know their score as soon as they finish.

Finding out grade status

Grades in Powerschool are updated daily, instruction for how to log in should've been included in the letters delivered to parents.

Student responsibilities after an absence

Outline what the students will need to do when returning after an absence.

- Missed a day? Check with the teacher for any missed announcements or work.
- Late work can be turned in up until the last day of the semester, although the day work is scheduled to be turned in it becomes a zero in the grade book, if unfinished.
- Tests can be rescheduled, if possible let the teacher know beforehand.

Communication procedures with parents and families

When a student's grade falls below 60% the teacher will report this to the student's home school counselor. Depending the quality of responses the teacher may or may not move to contact a parent themselves.

Ending class

Five to fifteen minutes before class ends, students need to clean up any messes they have made during the lab time and change back in to regular school clothes if needed. Remain in the classroom/lab until dismissed by the loudspeaker.
