Standards Terminology

• **in print and alphabetic knowledge** – in written form or through the understanding of letters, shapes, names, and sounds

Content: What do we want students to KNOW?	Skills: What do we want students to be able to DO?
 personally meaningful words – words that are relevant and important to the child (i.e., their own name, mom, dad, signs) (e.g., name tag, exit, library, women's/girl's bathroom, men's/boy's bathroom) 	recognize – to identify or point to; based on prior knowledge or experience
 print in their environment – print students experience in their daily lives (e.g., store names, road signs, magazines, labels on food, etc.)
